Definitions:

- The Contract means the documents forming the tender and acceptance thereof and the formal agreement executed between the competent authority on behalf of the Director. NIT Silcher and the Contractor, together with the documents referred to therein including these conditions, the specifications, designs, drawings and instructions issued from time to time by the Engineer-in-Charge and all these documents taken together, shall be deemed to form one contract and shall be complementary to one another.
- In the contract, the following expressions shall, unless the context otherwise requires, have the meanings, hereby respectively assigned to them: ,
 - f) The expression works or work shall, unless there be something either in the subject or context repugnant to such construction, be construed and taken to mean the works by or by virtue of the contract contracted to be executed whether temporary or permanent, and whether original, aftered, substituted or additional.
 - ii) The Site shall mean the land/or other places on, into or through which work is to be executed under the contract or any adjacent land, path or street through which work is to be executed under the contract or any adjacent land, path or street which may be allotted or used for the purpose of carrying out the contract.
 - iii) The Cuntractor shall mean the individual, firm or company, whether incorporated or not, undertaking the works and shall include the legal personal representative of such individual or the persons composing such firm or company, or the successors of such firm or company and the permitted assignees of such individual, firm or company.
 - M) The Director means the Director NIT Silchar.

The several documents forming the contract are to be taken as mutually explanatory of one anothElr, detailed drawings being followed in preference to small scale drawing and figured dimensions in preference to scale and special conditions in preference to General Conditions.
- 8.1 In the case of discrepancy between the schedule of quantities, the specifications and/orthe drawings, the following order of preference shall be observed:
 - Description of Schedule of Quantities.
 - Particular Specification and Special Condition, if any.
 - iii) Drawings.
 - M) C.P.W.D Specifications.
 - Indian Standard Specifications of 8.1.S.
- 8.2 If there are varying or conflicting provisions made in anyone document forming part of the contract, the Accepting Authority shall be the deciding authority with regard to the intention of the document and his decision shall be final and binding on the contractor.
- 8.3 Any error in description, quantity or rate in Schedule of Quantities or any omission therefrom shall not vitiate the Contract or release the Contractor from the execution of the whole or any part of the work comprised therein according to drawings and specifications or from any of his obligations under the contract. The competent authority reserves the right to include or omit any item of work which is not included in the tender specification but is found to be necessary to execute the work in total. The contractor is bound to carry out the work with this addition/omission at his quoted rates.

Signing of Contract

- The successful tenderen/contractor, on acceptance of his tender by the Accepting authority, shall, within 15 days from the stiputated date of start of the work sign the contract consisting of:
 - The notice inviting tender, all the documents including drawings, if any, forming the tender as issued at the time of invitation of tender and acceptance thereof together with any correspondence leading thereto.
 - ii) Standard agreement form consisting of (i) NIT, General terms and condition, clause of contract, price schedule of quantity, plan & elevation, minutes of negotiation held with the agency.

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CLAUSE-1

Recovery of Security Deposit The person/persons whose tender(s) may be accepted (hereinsfter called the contractor) shall permit the Institute at the time of making any payment to him for work done under the contract to deducted a sum at the rate of 10% of the gross amount of each running bit till the sum along with the sum already deposited as earnest money, will amount to security deliposit of 10% of the tendered value of the work subject to a maximum of Rs. 5,00,000/. Such deductions will be made and hold by the I institute by way of Security Deposit unless he/they has/have deposited the amount of Security at the rate mentioned above in cash or in the form of Bank securities or fixed deposit receipts or Guarantee Bonds of any Scheduled Bank or the State Bank of India in accordance with the form annexed hereto. In case a fixed deposit receipt of any Bank is furnished by the contractor to the Institute as part of the security deposit and the Bank is unable to make payment against the said fixed deposit receipt, the loss caused thereby shall fall on the contractor and the contractor shall forthwith on demand furnish additional security to the Institute to make good the defect.

All compensations or the other sums of money payable by the contractor under the terms of this contract may be deducted from, or paid by the sale of a sufficient part of his security deposit or from the interest stising therefrom, or from any sums which may be due to or may become due to the contractor by Institute on any account whatsoever and in the event of his Security Deposit being reduced by reason of any such deductions or sale as aforesald, the contractor shall within 10 days make good in cash or guarantee Bond in favour of the Director, NIT Silchar or fixed deposit receipt tendered by the State Bank of India or by Scheduled Banks (in case of guarantee offered by Scheduled Banks, the amount shall be within the financial limits prescribed by the Reserve Bank of India); or Govt. Securities (if deposited for more than 12 months) endersed in favour of the Director, NIT Silcher, any sum or sums which may have been deducted from, or raised by sale of his security deposit orang part thereof. The security deposit shall be collected from the running bits of the contractor at the raises mentioned above and the Earnest money if deposited in cash at the time of tenders will be treated a part of the Security Deposit.

Note-1: Govt. papers tendered as security will be taken at 5% (five per cent) below its market price or at its face value, whichever is less. The market price of Govt. paper would be ascertained by the Engineer-in-chargest the time of collection of interest and the amount of interest to the extent of deficiency in value of the Govt. paper will be withheld if necessary.

Note-2: Institute Securities will include all forms of Securities mentioned in rule No. 274 of the G.
-F. Rules except fidelity band. This will be subject to the observance of the condition mentioned under the rule against each form of security.

CLAUSE-2

Compensati on for Delay if the contractor fails to maintain the required progress in terms of dause 5 or to complete the work and clear the site on or before the contract or extended date of completion, he shall without prejudice to any other right or remedy available on account of such breach, pay as agreed compensation the amount calculated at the rates adjusted below or such smaller amount as the Director (whose decision in writing shall be too and binding) may decide on the amount of tendered value of the work for every completed dryweek (as applicable) that the progress remains below that specified in clause 5 or that the work remains incomplete.

This will also apply to items or group of items for which a separate period of completion has been specified.

- i) Completion period (as originally stipulated) not exceeding 3 months @ 1 % per day.
- i) Completion, period (as originally stipulated) not exceeding 3 months @ 1% per week.

Provided always that the total amount of compensation for delay to be paid under this condition shall not exceed 10% of the Tendered Value of work or of the Tendered Value of the item or group of items of work for which a separate period of completion is originally given.

The amount of compensation may be adjusted or set- off against any sum payable to the contractor under this or any other contract with Institute.

CLAUSE - 3

When contract can be determined

Subject to other provisions contained in this clause the Engineer-in-charge may, without prejudice to his any other rights or remedy against the contractor in respect of any delay inferior workmanship, any claims for damages and/or any other provisions of this contract or otherwise, and whether the date of completion has or has not elapsed, by notice in writing absolutely determine the contract in any of the following cases:

- i) If the contractor having been given by the Engineer-in-Charge a notice in writing to rectify, reconstruct or replace any defective work or that the work is being- performed in an ideflicient or otherwise improper or un-workman like manner shall omit to comply with the requirement of such notice for a period of seven days thereafter.
 - ii) If the contractor being a company shall pass a resolution or the court shall make an order that the company shall be wound up or if a receiver or a manager on behalf of a creditor shall be appointed or if circumstances shall arise which entitle the court or the creditor to appoint a receiver or a manager or which entitle the court to make a winding up order
 - (iii) If the contractor has, without reasonable cause, suspended the progress of the work or has failed to proceed with the work with due diligence so that in the opinion of the Engineer-in-Charge (which shall be final and binding) he will be unable to secure completion of the work by the date for completion and continues to go so after notice in writing of seven days from the Engineer-in-Charge
 - iv) If the contractor falls to complete the work within the stipulated date or items of work with individual date of completion, if any stipulated, on or before such date(is) of completion and does not complete them within the period specified in a notice given in writing in that berialf by the Engineer-in-Charge.
 - v) If the contractor persistently neglects to carry out his obligations under the contract and/or commits default in complying with any of the terms and conditions of the contract and does not remedy it or take effective steps to remedy it within 7 days after a notice in writing is given to him in that behalf by the Engineer-inCharge.

CLAUSE - 4

Contractor liable to pay compensation even if action not taken under Clause-3

In any case in which any of the powers conferred upon the Engineer-in-Charg by Clause 3 thereof, shall have become exercisable and the same are not exercised, the nonexercise thereof shall not constitute a waiver of any of the conditions hereof and such powers shall notwithstanding be exercisable in the event of any future case of default by the contractor and the lial:::ility of the contractor for compensation shall remain unaffected. In the event of the Engineer-in-Charge sutting in force all or any of the powers vested in him under the preceding clause he may, if he so desires after giving a notice in writing to the contractor, take possession of the sole discretion of the Engineer-in-Charge which shall be final and binding on the contractor) use as on hire (the amount of the hire money being also in the final determination of the Engineerin-Charge) all or any tools. Plant, materials and ~tores, in ar apon the works, or the site thereof belonging to the contractor or procured by the contractor and intended to be used for the execution of the work/or any part thereof, paying or allowing for the same in account at the contract rates, or in the case of these not being applicable, at current market rates to be certified by the Engineer-in-Charge whose certificate thereof shall be final, and binding on the contractor, cleri< of the works, foreman or other authorized agent to remove such tools, plant, materials, or stores from the premises (within a time to be specified in such notice) in the event of the confined or failing to comply with any such requisition, the Engineer-in-Charge may remove them at the contractor's expense or sell them by auction or private sale on account of the contractor and his risk in all respects and the certificate of the Engineer-in-Charge as to the expenses of any such removal and the amount of the proceeds and expenses of any such sale shall be final and conclusive against the contractor.

CLAUSE -6

Time and extension for delay The time allowed for execution of the works shall be the essence of the Contract. The execution of the works shall commence from the 15th Day or such time period as mentioned in letter of Award after the date 0:*. which Engineer in Charge Issues written orders to commence the work or from the date of handing over the site which ever is later. If the Contractor commits default in commencing the execution of the work as aforesaid, the Institute shall without prejudice to any other right or remedy available in law, be at liberty to forfeit the earnest money absolutely.

5.1 As soon as possible after the Contract is concluded it a Contractor shall submit a Time and Progress Chart and get it approved by the Department. The chart shall be prepared in direct relation to the time stated in the contract documents for completion of items of the works. It shall indicate the forecast of the dates of commencement and completion of various traces of sections of the work and may be amended as neces sary by agreement between the Engineer-in-charge and the contractor.

5.2 If the work(s) be delayed by:

- Force majeure, or
- Abnormatly bad weather, or
- ili) Serious loss or damage by fire, or
- Civil commetion, local commetion of workmen, strike or lockout, affecting any of the trades employed on the work or
- Delay on the part of other contractors or tradesmen engaged by Engineer-in Charge in executing work not forming part of the contract.

Then upon the happening of any such event causing delay the contractor shall immediately give notice thereof in writing to the Engineer-in-charge but shall nevertheless use constantly his best endeavors to prevent or make good the delay and shall do all that may be reasonably required to the satisfaction of the Engineer-in-Charge to proceed with the works.

5.3 Request for extension of time, to be eligible for consideration, shall be made by the Contractor in writing within fourteen days of the happening of the event causing delay on the prescribed form. The Contractor may also, if practicable, indicate in such a request the period for which extension is desired.

Mandane Texts of work Done

5.4 In any such case the authority may give a fair and reasonable extension of time forcompletion of work. Such extension shall be communicated to the Contractor by the Engineer-inCharge in writing, within 3 months of the date of receipt of such request. But compensation in any form during such extended period is not admissible. Non application by the contractor for ext~nsion of time shall not be a bar of giving a fair and reasonable extension by the Engineer-in-Charge and this shall be binding on the contractor.

CLAUSE-8

Engineer-in-Charge shall, except as otherwise provided, ascertain and determine by measurement the value in accordance with the contract of work done.

All measurement of all item having financial value shall be entered in Measurement Book and/or level field book so that a complete record is obtained of all works performed under the contract.

All measurements and levels shall be taken jointly by the Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative and by the contractor or his authorized representative time to time during the progress of the work and such measurements shall be singed and dated by the Engineerin-Charge and the contractor ortheir representatives in token of their acceptance~ if the contractor objects to any of the measurements recorded, a note shall be made to that effect with reason and signed by both the parties.

If for any reason the contractor or his authorized representative is not available and the work of recording measurements is suspended by the Engineer-In-Charge or his representative, the Engineer-in-Charge and the Department shall not entertain any claim from contractor for any loss or damages on this account. If the contractor or his authorized representative does not remain present at the time of such measurements after the contractor or his authorized representative has been given a notice in writing three (3) days in advance or fails to countersign or to record objection within a week from the date of the measurements, then such measurements recoded in his absence by the Engineer-in-Charge or his representative shall be deemed to be accepted by the contractor.

The contractor shall, without extra charge, provide all assistance with every appliance, labour and other things necessary for measurements and recording levels.

Except where any general or detailed description of the work expressly shows to the contrary, measurements shall be taken in accordance with the procedure set forth in the specifications notwithstanding any provision in the relevant Standard Method of measurement or any general or local custom. In case of items which are not covered by specifications, measurements shall be taken in accordance with the relevant standard method of measurement issued by the Bureau of Indian Standards and if for any item no such standard is available then a mutually agreed method shall be followed.

The contractor shall give not less than seven days' notice to the Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative Incharge of the work before covering up or otherwise placing beyond the reach of measurement any work in order that the same may be measured and correct dimensions thereof be taken before the same is covered up or placed beyond the reach of measurement and shall not cover up and place beyond reach of measurement any work without consent in writing of the Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative incharge of the work who shall within the aforesaid period of seven days inspect the work, and if any work shall be covered up or placed beyond the reach of measurements without such notice having been given or the Engineer-in-Charge consent being obtained in writing the same shall be uncovered at the contractors expense, or in default thereof no payment or allowances shall be made for such work of the materials with which the same was executed.

Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative may cause either themselves or through another officer of the department to ch~ck the measurements recorded jointly or otherwise as aforesaid and all provisions stipulated herein above stratibe applicable to such checking of measurements or levels.

It is also a term of this contract that recording of measurements of any item of work in the measurement book and/or its payment in the interm, on account or final bill shall not be considered as conclusive evidences as to the sufficiency of any work or material to which it relates nor shall it relieve the contractor from liabilities from any over measurement or defects noticed till completion of the defects liability period.

Clause: 6A

Engineer-in-Charge shall, except as otherwise provided, ascertain and determine by measurement the value of work done in accordance with the contract.

All measurements of all items having financial value shall be entered by the contractor and compiled in the shape of the Computerized Measurement Book having pages of A-4 size as per the format of the department so that a complete return is obtained of all items of works performed under the contract.

All such measurements and levels recorded by the contractor or his authorized representative from time to time, during the progress of the white; that be got checked by the Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative as per interest or program fixed in consultation with Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative. After the necessary corrections made by the Engineer-in-Charge, the measurement sheets shall be returned to the contractor for incorporating the corrections, and former for issue to the Engineer-in-Charge for the dated signatures by the Engineer-in-Charge and the contractor or their representatives in token of their acceptance.

Whenever bill is due for payment, the contractor would initially submit draft computerized measurement sheets and these measurements would be got checked frest checked from the Engineer-In-Charge and / or his authorized representative. The contractor will, thereafter, incorporate such changes as may be done during these checks/test checks in his draft computerized measurements, and submit to the department a computerized measurement book, duly bound and with its pages machine numbered. The Engineer-In-Charge and / or- his authorized representative would thereafter check this MB, and record the necessary certificates for their checks / test checks.

The final, fair, computerized measurement book given by the contractor, duly bound, with its pages machine numbered, should be 100% correct, and no cutting or over-writing in the measurements would thereaft~r be allowed. If at all any error is noticed, the contractor shall have to submit a fresh computerized MB cancelled by the department. Thereafter, the MB shall be taken in the Division Officer records, and allotted a number as per the Register of computerized MBs. This should be done before the corresponding bill is submitted to the Division Officer for payment. The contractor shall submit two spare copies of such computerized MB's for the purpose of reference and record by the various Officers of the department.

The contractor shall also submitto the department separately his computerized Abstract of Cost and the bill based on these measurements, duly bound, and its pages machine numbered alongwith two space copies of the *bill. Thereafter, this bill will be processed by the Division Office and allotted a number as per the computerized record in the same way as done for the measurement book meant for measurements.

The contractor shall, without extra charge, provide all assistance with every appliance, labour and other things necessary for checking of measurements/levies by the Engineerin-Charge or his representative.

Except where any general or detailed description of the work expressly shows to the contrary, measurements shall be taken in accordance with the procedure set forth in the specifications notwithstanding any provision in the relevant Standard Method of measurement or any general or local custom. In the case of items which are not covered by specifications, measurements shall be taken in accordance with the relevant standard method of measurement issued by the Bureau of Indian Standards and if for any item no such standard is available then a mutually agreed method shall be followed.

The contractor shall give not less than seven days' notice to the Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative in charge of the work before covering up or otherwise placing beyond the reach of checking and/or test checking the measurement of any work in order that the same may be checked and/or test checked and correct dimensions thereof be taken before the same is covered up or placed beyond the reach of checking and/or test checking measurement and shall not cover up and place beyond reach of measurement any work without consent in writing of the Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative incharge of the work who shall within the aforesaid period of seven days inspect the work, and if any work shall be covered up or placed beyond the reach of checking and/or test checking measurements without such notice having been given or the Engineer-in-Charge's consent being obtained in writing the same shall be uncovered at the Contractor's expense, or in default thereof no payment or allowance shall be made for such work or the materials with which the same was excuted.

Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative may cause either themselves or through another officer of the department to check the measurements recorded by contractor and all provisions stipulated herein above shall be applicable to such checking of measurements or levels.

It is also a term of this contract that checking and/or test checking the measurements of any item of work in the measurement book and/or its payment in the interim, on account offinal bill shall not be considered as conclusive evidence as to the sufficiency of any work or material to which it relates nor shall it relieve the contractor from liabilities from any over measurement or defects noticed till completion of the defects liability period.

CLAUSE - 7

Payment on Intennediate certificate to be regarded as advances

No payment shall be made for work, estimated to cost Rs. Twenty thousand or less till after the whole of the work shall have been completed and certificate of completion given. For works estimated to cost over Rs. Twenty thousand the interim or running account bills shall be submitted by the contractor for the work executed on the basis of such recorded measurements on the format of the Department in triplicate on or before the date of every month fixed for the same by the Engineer-in-Charge. The contractor shall not be entitled to be paid any such interim payment if the gross work done together with net payment! adjustment of advances for material collected, if any since the last such payment is less, than the amount specified in Schedule in which case the interim bill shall be prepared on the appointed date of the month after the requisite progress is achieved. Engineer-in-Charge shall arrange to have the bill verified by taking or causing to be taken, where necessary, the requisite measurements of the work, the the event of the failure of the contractor to submit the bills, Engineer-inCharge shall crepare or cause to be prepared such bills in which event no claims whatscever due to delay on payment including that of interest shall be payable to the contractor. Payment on account of amount admissible shall be made by he Engineer-in-Charge certifying the sum to which the contractor is considered entitled by way of interim payment at such sales as decided by the Engineer-In-Chargo. The amount admissible shall be paid by 1 bits working day after the day of presentation of the bill by the contractor to the Engineer in Charge or his Asst. Engineer together with the account of the material issued by the department, or dismantled materials, if any. In the case of work outside the headquarters of the Engineer-in-Charge the period of ten working days will be extended to litteen working days.

All such interim payments shall be regarded as payment by way of advances against final payment and shall not preclude the requirement of that, sessound and imperfect or unskilled work to be rejected, removed, taken away and reconstructed or re-crected. Any certificate given by the Engineer-in-Charge relating to the next done or materials delivered forming part of such payment, may be modified or corrected by any subsequent such certificate(s) or by the final certificate and shall not by their be conclusive evidence that any work or materials to which it relates is/are in accordance with the contract and specifications. Any such interim payment, or any part thereof that not in any respect conclude, determine oraffect in any way powers of the Engineer in Charge under the contract or any of such payment s be treated as final settlement and educations or in any way vary or affect the contract.

Pending consideration of extension of date of completion interim payments shall continue to be made as herein provided, without prejudice to the right of the department to take action under the terms of this contract for delay in completion of work, if the extension of date of completion is not granted by the competent authority.

The Engineer-In-Charge in his sole discretion on the basis of certificate from the Asst. Engineer to the effect that the work has been completed upto the level in question make interim advance payments without detailed measurements for Work done (other than foundations, items to be covered under finishing items) upto linter level (including sunshade etc.) and slab level, for each floor working out at 75% of the assessed value. The advance payments so allowed shall be adjusted in the subsequent interim bill by taking detailed measurements thereof.

CLAUSE-8

Configuration Configuration Configuration Room

Within ten days of the completion of the work, the contractor shall give notice of such completion to the Engineer-in-Charge and within thirty days of the receipt of such notice the Engineerin-Charge shall inspect the work and if there is no defect in the work shall furnish the contractor with a final certificate of completion, otherwise a provisional certificate of physical completion indicating defects (a) to be rectified by the contractor and/or (b) for which payment will be made at reduced rates, shall be issued. But no final certificate of completion shall be issued, nor shall the work be considered to be completed until the contractor shall have removed from the premises on which the work shall be executed all Staffolding, surplus materials, rubbish and all huts and sanitary arrangements required for his/thei(work people on the site in connection with the execution of the works as shall have been crected or constructed by the contractor(s) and cleaned off the dirt from all wood work, doors, windows, walks, floor or other parts of the building, in, upon; or about which the work is to be executed or of which he may have had possession for the purpose of the execution thereof, and not until the work shall have been measured by the Engineer-In-Charge. If the contractor shall tall to comply with the requirements of this clause as to removal of scuffcluing, surplus materials and rubbish and all huts and sanitary arrangements as aforesaid and cleaning off dirt on or before the date fixed for the completion of work, the Engineer-in-Charge may at the expense of the contractor remove such scaffolding, surplus materials and rubbish etc., and dispose of the same as he thinks fit and clean off such dirt as aforesaid, and the contractor shall have no claim in respect of scaffolding or surplus materials as aforesaid except for any sum actually released by the sale thereof.

CLAUSE - 8A

Composito Mag sile Cast When the annual repairs and maintenance of works are carried out, the splashes and droppings from white washing, colour washing, painting etc. on walls, floor, windows etc. shall be removed and the surface cleaned simultaneously with the completion of these items of work in the individual rooms, quarters or premises etc. where the work is done without waiting for the actual completion of all the other items of work in the contract. In case the contractor fails to comply with the requirements of this clause, the Engineer-in-Charge shall have the right to get this work done at the cost of the contractor other departmentally or through any other agency. Before taking such action, the Engineer-in-Charge shall give ten days notice in writing to the contractor.

CLAUSE - 8B

Completion Plans to be sub mitted by the contractor

The contractor shall submit completion plan as required vide General Specifications for Electrical works (part-I internal) 1972 and (Part-II External) 1974 as applicable within thirty days of the completion of the work.

In case, the contractor falls to submit the completion plan as aforesaid, he shall be liable to pay a sum equivalent to 2.5% of the value of the work subject to a ceiling of Rs 15,000.00 (Rupees fifteen thousand only) as may be fixed by the Director and in this respect the decision of the Director shall be final and binding on the contractor.

CLAUSE-9

Payment of Final Bill

The final bill shall be submitted by the contractor in the same manner as specified in interim bills within three months of physical completion of the work or within one month of the date of the final certificate of completion furnished by the Engineer-In-Charge whichever is earlier. No further claims shall be made by the contractor after submission of the final bill and these shall be deemed to have been waived and extinguished.

CLAUSE - 9A

Payment of Contractor's Bills to Banks

Payments due to the contractor will be made in the name of this firm by account payce cheque.

CLAUSE-10

Materials supplied by Institution

Materials which will be supplied by the Institute will specify the quantum, place of issue and rate(s) to be charged in respect thereof. The contractor shall be bound to procure them from the Engineer-in-Charge.

As soon as the work is awarded, the contractor shall fine the programme for the completion of work as per clause 5 of this contract and shall give his estimates of materials required on the basis of drawings/or schedule of quantities of the work. The contractor shall give in writing his requirement of the Engineer to Charge which shall be issued to him keeping in view the progress of work as assessed by the Engineer-in-Charge, in accordance with the agreed phased programme of work introduced monthly requirements of various materials. The contractor shall place his index is writing for issue of such materials at least 7 days in advance of his requirement.

Such materials shall be supplied for the purpose of the contractor only and the value of the materials so supplied at the rates specified in the affirmed schedule shall be set off or deducted, as and when materials are consumed in terminal work (including normal wastage) for which payment is being made to the contractor, then any sum then due or which may therefore become due to the contractor under the contractor or otherwise or from the security deposit. At the time of submission of bills the contractor shall certify that balance of materials supplied is available at site in original good condition.

The contractor shall submit alongwith every number of the ecount or interim billy materialwise reconciliation statements supported by samplete calculations reconciling total issue, total consumption and certified balance (direct extraction-wise in the case of steel) and resulting variations and reasons therefore. Engineer-in-Charge shall (whose decision shall be final and binding on the constant of the within his rights to follow the procedure of recovery in clause 42 at any stage of the number reconciliation is not found to be satisfactory.

The contractor shall bear the cost of getting the material issued, loading, transporting to site, ... unloading, storing under cover as required cutting assembling and joining the several parts together as necessary. Not withstanding anything to the contrary contained in any other clause of the contract and (or the CPWD Code) all stores/materials so supplied to the contractor or produced with the assistance of the Institution shall remain the absolute property of institution and the contractor shall be the trustee of the stores/materials, and the said stores/materials shall not be removed/disposed off from the site of the work on any account and shall be at all times open to inspection by the Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized agent. Any sluch stores/materials remaining unused shall be returned to the Engineer-in-Charge in as good a condition in which they were originally supplied at a place directed by him, at a place of issue or any other place specified by him as he shall require, but in case it is decided not to take back the stores/materials so supplied to him as aforesaid and not used by him or for any wastage in or damage to in such stores/materials.

On being required to return the store-/materials, the contractor shall hand over the stores/ materials on being paid or credited such price as Engineer-in-Charge shall determine, having due regard to the condition of the stores/materials. The price allowed for credit to the contractor, however, shall be at the prevailing Itlarket rate not exceeding the amount charged to him, excluding the storage charge, if any. The decision of the Engineer-in-Charge shall be final and conclusive. In the eyeat of breach of the aforesaid condition, the contractor shall in addition to throwing himself open to account for contravention of the terms of the licences or permit and/or for criminal breach of trust, be liable to institution for all advantage or profits resulting or which in the usual course would, have resulted to him by reason of such breach. Provided that the contractor shall in no case be entitled to any compensation or damages on account of any delay in supply or non-supply thereof all or any such. materials and stores provided further that the contractor shall be bound to execute the entire work if the materials are supplied by the Institution within the original scheduled time for completion of the work plus 50% thereof or schedule time plus 6 months whichever is more if the time of completion of work exceeds 12 months butifa part of the materials only has been supplied within the aforesaid period then the contractor shall be bound to do so much of the work as may be possible with the materials and stores supplied in the aforesaid period. For the completion of the rest of the work, the contractor shall be. entitled to such extension of time as may be determined by the Engineer-in-Charge whose decision in this regard shall be final and binding on the contractor.

The contractor shall see that only the required quantities of materials are got issued. Any such material remaining unused and in perfectly good/original condition at the time of completion or determination of the contract shall be returned to the Engineer -in-Charge at the stores from which it was issued orat a place directed by him by a notice in writing. The contractor shall not be entitled for loading, transporting, unloading and stCloking of such unused material except for the extra lead, if any involved, beyond the original place of issue.

Waterials to be provided by the Cop tractor The contractor shall, at his own expense, provide all materials, required for the work. The contractor shall, at his own expense and without delay, supply to the Engineer-in-Charge samples of materials to be used on the work and shall get these approved in advance. The contractor shall, if requested by the Engineer-in-Charge furnish proof, to the satisfaction of the Engineer-in-Charge that the materials so comply. The Engineer-in-Charge shall within thirty days of supply of samples or within such further period as he may require intimate to the contractor in writing whether samples are approved by him or not. If samples are no approved, the contractor shall forthwith arrange to supply to the Engineer-in-Charge for his approval fresh samples complying with the specifications laid down in the contract. When materials are required to be tested in accordance with specifications, approval of the Engineer-in-Charge shall be issued after the test, results are received.

The contractor shall at his risk and cost submit the semples of mC!terials to be tested, or, analyzed and shall not make use of or incorporate in the work any materials represented by the samples until the required tests or analysis have been mad—and materials finally so depted by the Engineer-in-Charge. The contractor shall not be eligible for any claim or compensation either arising out of any delay in the work or due to any corrective measures required to be taken on account of and as a result of testing of materials.

The contractor shall, at his risk and cost, make as an angements and shall provide all facilities as the Engineer-in-Charge may require for collecting and preparing the required number of samples for such tests at such time and to such place or places as may be directed by the Eriginear-in-Charge and bear all charges and cost testing unless specifically provided for otherwise elsewhere in the contractor specifications. The Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative shall at all times have access to the works and to all workshops and places where work is being prepared or from where materials, manufactured articles or machinery are being obtained for the works and the contractor shall afford every facility and every assistance in obtaining the most to such access.

The Engineer-in-Charge shall have full powers to require the removal from the promises of all materials which in his opinion are not in accordance with the specifications and in case of default the Engineer-in-Charge shall be at liberty to employ at the expense of the contractor, other persons to remove the same without before enswerable or accountable for any loss or damage that may happen or arise to such materials. The Engineer-in-Charge shall also have full powers to require other proper enterings to be substituted thereof and in case of default the Engineer-in-Charge may cause the same to be supplied and all costs which may attend such removal and substitution and the borne by the contractor.

- (b) Under the provision of Minimum Wages (Central) Rules 1950, the contractor is bound to allow to the labours directly or indirectly employed in the works one day rest for 6 days continpous work and pay wages at the same rate as for duty. In the event of default the Engineer-in-Charge shall have the right to deduct the sum or sums not paid on account of wages for weekly holders to any labours and pay the same to the persons entitled thereto from any money due to the contractor by the Engineer-in-Charge concerned.
- V) The contractor shall comply with the provisions of the payment of wages Act, 1936, minimum wages Act, 1948, Employees Liability Act, 1 3.28, workmen's compensation Act, 1923, Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, Materials Benefits Act, 1961, and the Contractor's Labour (R&A) Act 1970, or the modifications thereof or any other laws relating thereto and the rules made there under from time to time.
- Vi) The contractor shall indemnify and keep indemnified his fastion against payments to be made under and for the observance of the term aforesaid and the CPWD Contractor's Labour Regulations without prejudice to his right to claim indemnity from his sub-contractors.
- .vii) The laws aforesaid shall be deemed to be a part of this contract and any breach thereof shall be deemed to be a breach of this contract.
- viii) Whatever is the minimum wage for the time being, or thite wage payable is higher than such wage, such wage shall be paid by the compactant of the workmen directly without the intervention of Jamadar and that Jamadar shall not be entitled to deductor recover any amount from the minimum wage payable to fleworkmen as and by way of commission or otherwise.
- b) The contractor shall ensuring that no amount by way of commission or otherwise is deducted or recovered by the Jamadar from the wage of warfunen.

return in good order even though the same may not have been working for any cause except major breakdown due to no fault of the contractor or faulty use requiring more than three working days continuously (excluding intervening holidays and Sundays) for bringing the plant in order. The contractorshall immediately intimate in writing to the Engineer-in-Charge when any plant or machinery gets out order requiring major repairs as aforesaid. The Engineer-in-Charge shall record the date and time of receipt of such intimation in the log sheet of the plant or machinery. Based on this if the breakdown before lunch period or major breakdown will be computed considering half a day's breakdown on the day of complaint. If the breakdown occurs in the post lunch period of major breakdown will be computed starting from the next working day. In case of any dispute under this clause the decision of the Director shall be final and binding on the contractor.

Power fuel of approved type, firewood, kerosene oil etc. for running the plant and machinery and also the full time chowkidar for guarding the plant and machinery against any loss or damage shall be arranged by the contractor who shall be fully responsible for the safeguard and security of plant and machinery. The contractor shall on or before the supply of plant and machinery sign an agreement indomnitying the Department against any loss or damage caused to the plant and machinery either during transit or at site of work.
- (vii) Ordinarily no pant and machinery shall work for more than 8 hours a day inclusive on one hour lunch break. In case of an urgent work however, the Engineer-inCharge may at his discretion, allow the plant and machinery to be worked for more than normal period of 8 hours a day. In that case the hours have charges for overtime to be borne by the contractor shall be 50% more than the countain proportionate hourly charges (1/8th of the daily charges) subject to a minimum of half day's normal charges on any particular day. For working out hire charges for overtime a period of half an hour and above will be charged as one hour and a period of less than half an hour will be ignored.
- (viii) The contractor shall release that plant and machinery every seventh day for periodical servicing and/or wash out which may take about three to four hours or more. Hire charges for full day shall be recovered from the contractor for the day of servicing/ wash out irrespective of the period employed in servicing.
- (ix) The plant and machinery once issued to the contractors field not be returned by him on account of lack of arrangements of labour and materials, etc. on his part, the same will be returned only when they are required longinger repairs or when in the opinion of the Engineer-in-Charge the work or a portion of which the same was issued is completed.
- (x) Log Book for recording the hours of daily work for each unitse plant and machinery supplied to the contractor will be maintained by the experiment and will be countersigned by the contractor or his authorized agent only in case the contractor

contests the correctness of the entires and/ or falls to sign the Log Book the decision of the Engineer-in-Charge shall be final and binding on him. Hire charges will be calculated according to the entires in the Log Book and will be made for the minimum number of days worked out on the assumption that a roller can consolidate per day and maximum quantity of materials or area surfacing as noted against each in the annexed statement.

- (xi) In the case of concrete mixers, the contractors shall arrange to get the hopper cleaned and the drum washed at close of the work each day or each occasion.
 - (a) In case rollers for consolidation are employed by the contractor himself, log book for such rollers shall be maintained in the same manner asis done in case of departmental rollers, maximum quantity of any items to be consolidated for each roller-dayshall also be same as in Annexure to Clause 34(x). For less use of rollers recovery for the less roller days shall be made at the stipulated issued rate.
- (dv) The contractor shall be responsible to return the plant and machinery in the condition in which it was handed over to him and he shall be responsible for all damage caused to the said plant and machinery at the site of work or elsewhere in operation or otherwise or during transit including damage to or loss of parts, and for all losses due to his failure to return the same soon after the completion of the work for which it was issued. The Estate Officer shall be the sole judge to determine the liability of the contractor and its extent in this regard and his decision shall be final and binding on the contractor.
- (xii) The contractor will be exempted from levy of any hire charges for the number of days he is call ed upon in writing by the Engineer-In-Charge to suspend execution of the work, provided institute plant and machinery in question have, in fact, remained idle with the contractor because of the suspension.
- (xiii) In the event of the contractor not requiring any item of plant and machinery issued by Institute though not stipulated for issue in schedule any time after taking delivery at the place of issue, he may return it after two days written notice or at any time without notice if the agrees to pay hire charges for two additional days without. In any way, affecting the right of the Engineer-in-Charge to sue the said plant and machinery during the said period of two days as he like including hiring out to a third party.

CLAUSE - 35

- The contractor undertakes to make arrangement for the supervision of the work by the firm supplying the tar or bitumen used.
- (ii) The contractor shall collect the total quantity of far or bitumen required for the work as per standard formula, before the process of painting is started and shall hypothecate it to the Engineer-in-Charve, If any bitumen or tar remains unused on completion of the work on account of lesser use of materials in actual or ecution for reasons other than authorized changes of specification and abandonment of portion of work, a corresponding deduction equivalent to the cost of unused materials as determined by the Engineer-in-Charge shall be made and the material return to the contractors.

Parent Male

The contractor shall be responsible for rectifying defects noticed within a year from the date of completion of the work and the portion of the security deposit relating to asphaltic work shall be refunded after the explry of this period.

Employment Of Technical Staff and employees

- The contractor shall provide all necessary superintendence during execution of the work and as along thereafter as may be necessary for proper fulfilling of the obligations under the contract.
- The contractor shall immediately after receiving I, etter of acceptance of the tender and before commen cement of the work, intimate in writing to the Engineer-inCharge the name, qualifications, experience, age, address and other particulars along with certificates, of the Principal technical representative to be in charge of the work. The Engineer-in-Charge shall within 15 days of receipt of such communication intimate in writing his approval or otherwise of such a representative to the contractor. Any such approval may at any time be withdrawn and in case of such withdraw the contractor shall appoint another such representative according to the provisions of this clause. Decision of the tender accepting authority shall be final and binding on the contractor in this respect. Such a principal technical representative shall be appointed by the contractor soon after receipt of the approval from Engineer-in-Charge and shall be available at site within aftern days of start of work.

If the contractor (or any partner in case of firm/company) who himself has such qualifications, it will not be necessary for the said contractor to appoint such a principal technical representative but the contractor shall designate and appoint a responsible agent to represent him and to be present at the work whenever the contractor is not in a position to be so present. All the provisions applicable to the principal technical representative, under the clause will also be applicable in such a case to contractor or his responsible agent. The principal technical representative and/or the contractor shall on receiving reasonable notice from the Engineer-in-Charge or his designated representative(s) in charge of the work in writing or in person or otherwise, present himself to the Engineerin-Charge and/or at the site of work, as required, to take instructions. Instructions given to the principal technical representative or the responsible agent shall be deemed to have the same force as ifthese have been given to the contractor. The principal technical representative/the contractor shall be available at site attest two working days every week, these days shall be determined in consultation with the Engineer-in-Charge as well as fully during important stage of execution of work, during recreating of measurement of works and whenever so required by the Engineer-in-Charge by a notice as aforesaid and shall also note down instructions conveyed by the Engineer-in-Charge or his designated representative in the site order book and shall affix his signature in token of noting down instructions and in token of acceptance measurements. There shall be no objection if the representative/agent looks after more than one work and not more than three works in the same station provided these details are disclosed to the Engineer-in-Charge and he shall be satisfied that the provisions and the purpose of this danse are fulfilled satisfactorily.

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Conditions for reimbursement of ievy/taxes If levied after receipt of tenders if the Engineer-in-Charge, whose decision in this respect is final and binding on the contractor, is convinced that no such technical representative or agent is effectively appointed or is effectively attending or fulfilling the provision of this clause, a recovery shall be effected from the contractor and decision of the Engineer-In-Charge as recorded in the site order book and measurement recorded in measurement books shall be final and binding on the contractor. Further if the contractor fails to appoint a suitable technical representative or responsible agent and if such appointed persons are not effectively present or do not discharge their responsibilities satisfactorily, the Engineer-in-Chame shall have full powers to suspend the execution of the work until such date as a suitable agent is appointed and the contractor shall be held responsible for the delay so caused to the work. The contractor shall submit a certificate of employment of the technical representative/responsible agent along with every on account bill/fixed bill and shall produce evidence if at any time so required by the Engineer-in-Charge.

ALL THE WORLD IN The contractorshall provide and employ on the site only such technical assistants as are skilled and experienced in their respective fields and such foremen and supervisory staff as are competent to give proper supervision to the work.

> The contractor shall provide .and employ skilled, somiskilled and unskilled labour as is , necessary for proper and timely execution of the work.

> The Engineer-in-Charge shall beat liberty to object to and require the contractor to remove from the works any person who in his opinion miscanducts himself, or is Incompetent or negligent in the performance of his duties or whose employment is otherwise considered by the Engineer-In-Charge to be undesirable. Such person. shall not be employed again at works site without the written permission of the Engineer-in-Charge and the persons so removed shall be replaced as soon as possible by competent substitutes.

CLAUSE - 37

LBVY/Taxes payable by can tractor

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- Sales Tax or any other tax on materials in respect of his contract shall be payable by the contractor and Institution shall not entertain any claim whatsoever in this respect.

If relation working in NITS then the contractor not allowed to tender The contractor shall not be permitted to tender for works in the NITS circle (responsible for award and execution of contacts) in which his near relative is posted as institute Accountant or as an Officer in any capacity between in the grades of the Director and Assistant Engineer (both inclusive). He shall also intimate the names of persons who are working with him in any capacity or are subsequently employed by him and who are near relatives to any Gazetted Officer in the C.P.WD or in the Ministry of Urban Development. Any breach of this condition by the contractor would render him liable to the removed from the approved list of contractors of this Department. If however the contractor is registered in any other department, he shall be debarred from tendering in NITS for any breach of this condition.

removal of serviceable material and for reconstruction of all works ordered by the Engineer-InCharge, such payments being in addition to compensation upto the value of the work originally executed before being damaged or destroyed and not paid for. In case of works damaged or destroyed but not already measured and paid for, the compensation shall be assessed by the Estate Officer upto Rs. 5,000/- and by the Director concerned for a higher amount. The contractor shall be paid for the damages/destruction suffered and for restoring the material at the rate based on analysis of rates tendered for in accordance with the provision of the contract. These rules shall apply to all buildings and construction works in charge of Central Public Works DepartmentiPWD (DA) in which twenty or more wOrkers are ordinarily employed or are proposed to be employed in any day during the period during which the contract work is in progress.

2. DEFINITION

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Work place means a place where twenty or more workers are ordinarily employed in connection with construction of work on any day during the period during which the contract work is in progress.

FIRST-AID FACILITIES

- A THE REPORT TWO LET At every work place there shall be provided and maintained, so as to be easily accessible during working hours, first-aid boxes at the rate of not less than 1 1 2 6 6 3 1 one box for 150 contract labour or part thereof ordinarily employed.

- Adequate arrangements shall be made for immediate recoupment of the equipment when necessary.
- Nothing except the prescribed contents shall be kept in the First-aid box.
- The first-aid box shall be kept in charge of a responsible person who shall always be readily available during the working hours of the work place.
- A person in charge of the First-aid box shall be a person trained in First-aid treatment, in the work places where the number of contract labour employed is 150 or more.
- iii) In work places where the number of contract labour employed is 500 or more and hospital facilities are not available within easy distance from the works. First-aid posts shall be established and run by a trained compounder. The compounder shall be on duty and shall be available at all hours when the workers are at work.
- Where work places are situated in places which are not towns or cities, a suitable motor transport shall be kept readily available to carry injured person or person suddenly taken III to the nearest hospital.

DRINKING WATER

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- i) In every work place, there shall be provided and maintained at suitable places, easily accessible to labour, a sufficient supply of cold water fit for drinking.
- Where drinking water is obtained from an I ntermittent public water supply, each work place shall be provided with storage where such drinking water shall be stored.
- Every water supply or storage shall be at a distance of not less than 50 feet from any latrine drain or other source of pollution. Where water has to be drawn from an existing well which is within such proximity of latrine, drain or any other source of pollution, the well shall be properly chlorinated before water is drawn form it for drinking. All such wells shall be entirely closed in and the provided with a trap door which shall be dust and waterproof.
- iv) A reliable pump shall be fitted to each covered well, the trap door shall be kept locked and opened only for cleaning or inspection which shall be done at least once a month.

5. WASHING FACILITIES

- In every work place adequate and suitable facilities for washing shall be provided and maintained for the use of contract labour employed therein.
- Separate and adequate cleaning facilities shall be provided for the use of male and female workers. iii) Such facilities shall be conveniently accessible and shall be kept in clean and hygenic condition.

6. LATRINES AND URNALS

- Latrines shall be provided in every work place on the thin wing scale namely:
 - a) Where female are employed there shall be at least one trains for every 25 females.

- b) Where males are employed, there shall be at least one latrine for every 25 males. Provided that where the number of males or females exceeds 100, it shall be sufficient if there is one latrine for 25 males or females as the case may be upto the first 100, and one for every 50 thereafter.
- 15/10/2015/2012/01/20 Every latrine shall be under cover and so partitioned off as to secure privacy, and shall have a proper door and fastenings.

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- Chort the Control of Construction of latrines: The inside walls shall be constructed of masonry or some suitable heatresisting nonabsorbent materials and shall be cement washed inside and outside at least once a year, Latrines, shall not be of a standard lower thCin borehole system.
- M a) Where workers of both sexes are employed, there shall be displayed outside each block of latrine and urinal, a notice in the language understood by the majority of the workers "For Men only" or "For Women Only" as the case may be.
 - b) The notices shall also bear the figure of a man or of a woman, as the case may be.

 - a) The latrines and urinals shall be adequately lighted and shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition at all times.

 - Water shall be provided by means of tap or otherwise so as to be conveniently 14 1800 PASSON IN accessible in or near the latrines and urinals.
 - min Trail Control vii) Disposal of excreta: Unless otherwise arranged for by the local sanitary authority, arrangements for proper disposal of excreta by incineration at the work place shall be made by means of a suitable incinerator, Alternately excreta may be disposed of Lightle Address on by putting a layer of night soil at the bottom of a pucca tank prepared for the pur-pose and covering it with a 15 cm. layer of waster or refuse and then covering it with a layer of earth for a fortnight (when it will turn to manure).
- ix) The contractor shall at his own expense, carry out all Instructions Issued to him by the Engineerin-Charge to effect proper disposal of night soil and other conservancy work in respect of the contractor's workmen or employees on the site. The contractor shall be responsible for payment of any charges which may be levied by Municipat or Cantonment Authority for execution of such on his behalf.

7. PROVISION OF SHELTER DURING REST

At every place there shall be provided, free of cost, four suitable sheds, two for meals and the other two for rest separately for the use of men and WOmen labour. The height of each shelter shall not be less than 3 metres (10ft.) from the floor level to the lowest part of the roof. These shall be kept clean and the space provided shall be on the basis of 0,6sq.m. (Bsft) per head.

Provided that the Engineer-in-Charge may permit subject to his satisfaction, a portion of the building under construction or other alternative abcommodation to be used for the purpose.

8. CRECHES

- i) At every work place, at which 20 or more women worker are ordinarily employed, there shall be provided two rooms of reasonable dimensions for the use of their children under at the age of six years. One room shall be used as a play room for the children and the other as their bedroom. The rooms shall be constructed with specifications as per clause 19H (ii) a, b & c.
- The rooms shall be provided with suitable and sufficient openings for light and ventilation. There shall be adequate provision of sweepers to keep the places clean.
- iii) The contractor shall supply adequate number of toys and games in the play room and sufficient number of cots and beddings in the bed room.
- iv) The contractor shall provide one ayea to look after the children in the creche when the number of women workers does not exceed 50 and two when the number of women workers exceed 50.
- v) The use of the rooms earmarked as creches shall be restricted to children, their attendants and mothers of the children.

CANTEENS

- i) In every work place where the work regarding the employment of contract labour is likely to continue for six months and where in contract labour numbering one hundred or more are ordinarily employed and adequate canteen shall be provided by the contractor for the use of such contract labour.
- ii) The canteen shall be maintained by the contractor in an efficient manner.
- III) The canteen shall consist of at least a dining hall, kitchen, store room, pantry and washing places separately for workers and utensils.
- W) The canteen shall be sufficiently lighted at all times when any person has access to it.
- V) The floor shall be made of srTlooth and impervious materials and inside walls shall be limewashed or colour washed at least once in each year. Provided that the inside walls of the kitchen shall be lime-washed every four mooths.
- VI) The premises of the canteen shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition.
- Waste water shall be carried away in suitable covered drains and shall not be allowed to accumulate so as to cause a nuisance.
- viii) Suitable arrangements shall be made for the collection end disposal of garbage.
- The dining half shall accommodate at a time 30 per cert of the contract labour working at a time.
- x) The floor area of the dining hall, excluding the area occupied by the service counter and any furniture except tables and chairs shall not be less than one square meter (1 0 sft) per diner to be accommodate as prescribed in \$40.50.00.9.
- xi) a) A portion of the dining hall and service counter shall be partitioned off and reserved for women workers in proportion to their number.
- xii) b) Washing places for women shall be separate and screened to secure privacy. Sufficient tables stocks, chair or benches shall be available to the number of diners to be accommodated as prescribed in sub-Rule 9.
- xiii) (a) 1. There shall be provided and maintained sufficient densits crockery furniture and any other equipments necessary for the efficient running of the canteen.
 - The furniture utensils and other equipment shall be contributed in a clean and hygienic condition.
- (b) 1. Suitable clean clothes for the employees serving in the carteen shall be provided and maintained.

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- 2. A service counter, if provided, shall have top of smooth and impervious material.
- Sultable facilities including an adequate supply of hot water shall be provided for the cleaning of utensils and equipments.
- xiv) The foodstuffs and other items to be served in the canteen shall be in conformity with the normal habits of the contract labour.
- xv) The charges for foodstuffs, beverages and any other items served in the canteen shall be based on "No profit, No loss" and shall be conspicuously displayed in the canteen.
- In arriving at the price of food stuffs, and other article served in the canteen, the following items shall not be taken into consideration as expenditure namely:
 - a) The rent of land and building.
 - b) The depreciation and maintenance charge for the building and equipments provided for the canteen.
 - The cost of purchase, repairs and replacement of equipments including furniture, crockery, cuttery and utensils.
 - d) The water charges and other charges incurred for lighting and ventilation.
 - e) The interest and amounts spent on the provision and maintenance of equipments provided for the centeen.
- xvii) The accounts pertaining to the canteen shall be audited once every 12 months by registered accountants and auditors.

10. ANTI-MALARIAL PRECAUTIONS

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The contractor shall at his own expense, conform to all anti-malarial instructions given to him by the Engineer-in-Charge including the filling up of any borrow pits which may have been dug by him.

- The above rules shall be incorporated in the contracts and in notices inviting tenders and shall from an integral part of the contracts.
- Department may, from time to time, add to or amend these rules and issue direction - it may consider necessary for the purpose of removing any difficulty which may arise in the administration thereof.

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SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. DUTIES & POWER

Site Engineers:

The duties of the Site Engineer(s) are to watch and supervise the yvorks and the workmanship employed in connection withworks, and to test and examine any materials to be used.

ii) The Engineer-in-charge, from time to time in writing, delegate to the Site Engineer(s) any of the powers and authorities in them. Any written instruction or written approval given by the Engineer-in-charge to trye contractor shall bind the contractor to carry out the instruction in total.

2. ASSIGNMENT & SUBLETTING

The contractor shall not assign the contract or any part thereof or any benefit or interest therin or there under without the written consent of the Engin-er-in-charge. The whole of the works included in the contract shall be executed by the contractor except where otherwise provided in the contract. The contractor shall not sublet any part of the works without the written consent of the Engineer-in-charge and such consent, if given, shall not relieve the contractor from any liability or obligation under the contract, and he shall be responsible for the acts, defaults and neglects of sub-contractor, his agents servants or workmen.

3. SCOPE OF CONTRACT

The contract comprises the construction, completion and maintenance of the works for 6 (six) months after the completion, and the provision of all labour, materials, constructional plant, equipment and transportation, temporary works and everything, whether of a temporary or permanent nature required in and for such construction, completion and fi; lall itenance so far as the necessity for providing the same is specified in or reasonably to be inferred form the contract. The contractor shall make his own arrangements for the safe storage of materials, accommodation for his staff etc. and no claim for the temporary accommodation from the contractor shall be entertained.

The contractor shall carry out and complete the said work in every respect in accordance with this contractanc(as per th~ directions and to the _satisfaction of the Engineer-in-charge/Architect. Issue of further drawings and/or written collectively referred to as instructions of the Engineer-in-charge/ Architect's in regards;

4. CONTRACT DOCUMENT

The contractor shall give adequate notice in writing to the Engineer in charge of any further drawings or specification that may be required for the execution of the works or otherwise under the contract.

The Engineer-in-charge shall have full powers and authority in supply to the contractor from time to time during the progress of the work such drawings and instructions as shall be necessary for proper execution and the contractor shall carry out and be hound by the same

 Ganvassing in connection with tenders is prohibited and the tenders, submitted by the tenderers who resort to canvassing, are liable Jor rejection.

Tenderers are not allowed to make additions and alternations in the tender document. Any
additions and alternations, if incorporated in the tender, shall be atthe tenderer's risk
since the modified tender is liable for rejectic;m.

The contractor shall have to make his own arrangement of water. The drawalof water from the network of the Institute shall not be allowed in normal course.

4. Temporary electrical connection (single/three phase) shall be provided by the Institute from its distribution network and the charges shall be realized as per the existing estate rates per unit on the basis of actual consumption thro's separate sub-meter under the control of the Engineer-in-charge. The cable for service connection and the sub-meter shall be arranged by the contractor at his own cost.

5. CONDITIONS FOR CEMENT

i) The contractor shall produce 43 grade ordinary Portland cement conforming to 13:8112, as required in the work, from reputed manufacturer of cement having a production capacity of one million tones per annum or more. Supply of cement shall be taken in 50 Kg bags bearing manufacturers name and ISI marking. The brand of cement shall be got approved from Engineer-In-charge.

ii) The cement shall be brought at site in bulk supply of approximately 50 M,T or as

decided by the Engineer-in-charge.

iii) The cement godown of a suitable capacity, to store a minimum of 2500 bags of cement, shall be constructed by the contractor at site of work at his own cost. Double lock provision shall be made to the door of the cement godown. The keys of one lock shall remain with the Engineer-in-charge or his authorized representative and the key of the other lock shall remain with the contractor. The contractor shall be responsible for the watch and ward and safety of the cement godown. The contractor shall facilitate the inspection of the cement godown by the Engineer-in-charge or his authorized representative at any time during working hours.

6. CONDITIONS FOR STEEL

- i) The contractor shall procure TMT bars conforming to ISI 786: 2008 of the requirement to 500 D grade from primary producer TISCO OR SAIL as approved by Ministry of Steel.
- The steel reinforcement shall be brought at the site in bulk supply of 10 (ten) MT or more, as directed by the Engineer-in-charge.
- (iii) The steel reinforcement shall not be stored by the contractor at the sife of work on wet ground so as to prevent rusting. Bars of different sizes and lengths shall be stored separately to facilitate easy counting and checking.

CONDITIONS FOR SAND

- i) Zone-II or Zone-III sand is preferable. Sand evailable at this locality is generally of Zone-IV. If ZoneIV sand is used, 25% crusher sand of 4. 75mm down to be added with best quality Zone-IV sand approved/accepted by the Department and improve the quality of sand at as per Zone-III for R.C.C./C.C work. No extra cost will be paid for the purpose.
- The earnest money of the unsuccessful tenders shall be refunded on written raquest, within 1 (one) month of the award of work. The earnest money of the successful tenderer shall however be adjusted towards the security deposit.

9. TESTING

All materials of construction shall be tosted in the laboratory of Civil Engineering Department of NIT Silchar. The cost of such testing shall be borne by the contractor at a rate as per consultancy rules of the Institute. The test results shall comply with BISspecifications, in case the material fails to comply with specifications, the same shall be replaced by the contractor at his/her own cost.

For important structures like buildings etc., site soil exploration shall be carried out to ascertain the soil charateristics and bearing capacity. Such soil exploration shall be carried out through the Department of Civil Engineering, NIT Silcher. The cost of soil exploration and testing shall be bearing by the contractor.

Additional Condition - 01

Modification of Agreement incorporating computerized measurement book under clause: 6A in lieu of clause: 6 of CPWD General Condition of Contract 2008,

1. Name of work:

As per general conditioner agreement unaer clause-8; the record entries of the measurement for work done are recorded in the prescribed Measurement Book by the respective Engineers. In view of smooth progress of work the Computerized Measurement Book as per CPWD Gelleral Condition of Contract 2008 is introduced.

Clause: 6A

Engineer-in-Charge shall, except as otherwise provided, ascertain and determine by measurement the value of work done in accordance with the contract.

All measurements of all items having financia\value shall be entered by the contractor and compiled in the shape of the Computerized Measurement Book having 'pages of A-4 size as per the format of the department so that a complete record is obtained of all items of works performed under the contract.

All such mea'sun~ments and levels recorded by the contractor or his authorized representative from time to time, during the progress of the work, shall be got checked by the I;ontractor from the Engineer-inCharge or his authorized representative as per interval or program fixed, in consultation with Engineer-inCharge or his authorized representative. After th~ necessary corrections made by the Engineer-inCharge, the measurement sheets shall be returned to the contractor for incorporating the corrections and for resubmission to the Engineer-in-Charge for the dated signatores by the Engineer-in-Charge and the' contractor or their representatives in token of their acceptance.

Whenever bill is due for payment, the contractor would initially submit draft computerized measurement sheets and these measurements would be got checked/test checked from the Engineer-in-Charge and / or his authorized representative. The contractor will, thereafter, incorporate such changes as, may be done during these checks/test checks in his draft computerized measurements; and submit to the department a computerized measurement book, duly boul1d and with its pages machine numbered. The Engineer-in-Charge and / or his authorized representative would thereaft~r check this MB, and record the necessary certificates for their checks / test checks.

The 'final, lair, computerized measurement book given by the contractor, duly bound, with its pages machine numbered, should be 100% correct, and no cutting or over-writing in the measurements would thereafter be allowed. If at all any error is noticed, the contractor shall, have to submit a fresh computerizedMB with its pages duly machine numbered and bound, after'getting the earlier MB cancelled by the department. Thereafter, the MB shall be taken in the Division Office records, and allotted a number as per the Register of Computerized MBs. This should be done before the corresponding bill is submitted to the Division Office for payment. The contractor shall submit two, spare copies Qf such computerized MB's for the purpose of reference and record by the various officers of the department.

The contractor shall also submit to the department separately his computerized Abstract of Cost and the bill based on these measurements, duly bound, and its pages machine numbered along-with two spare copies of the "bill. Thereafter, this bill will be processed by the Division Office and allotted a number as per the computerized record in the same way as done for the measurement book meant for measurements.

The contractor shall, without extra charge, provide all assistance with 'every appliance, labour and other things necessary for checking of measurements/levels by the Engineer-in-Charge or his represent--tive.

Except where any general or detailed description of the work expressly shows to the contrary. 'measurements shall be taken in accordance with the procedure set forth in the specifications not instanting any provision in the relevant Standard Method of measurement or any general or local custom. In the case of items which are not covered by specifications, measurements shall be taken in accordance with the catewant standard method of measurement issued by the Bureau of Indian Standards' and. If for any itel) 1 no such standard is available then a mutually agreed method shall be followed.

Sentative in charge of the work before covering up or otherwise placing beyond the reach of, checking and/or test checking the measurement of any work in order that the same may be checked and/or test checked and correct dimensions thereof be taken before the same is covered up or placed beyond the reach of checking and/or test checking measurement and shall not cover up and place beyond reach of measurement any work without consent in writing of the Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative in-charge of the work who shall within the aforesald period of seven days inspect the work, and if any work shall be covered up or placed beyond the reach of checking and/or test checking measurements without such notice having been given or the Engineer-in-Charge's consent being obtained in writing the same shall be uncovered at the Contractor's expense, or in default thereof no payment or allowance shall be made for such work or the materials with which the same was executed.

Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative may cause either themselves or through another officer of the department to check the measurements recorded by contractor and all provisions stipulated herein above shall be applicable to such checking of measurements or levels.

It is also a term of this contract that checking and/or test checking the measurements of any item of work in the measurement book and/or its payment in the interim, on account of (inal bill shall not be considered as conclusive evidence as to the su'1; ficiency of any work or material to which it relates nor shall it relieve the contractor from liabilities from any over measurement or defects noticed till completion of the defects liability period.
